
British & German Military remember side by side




local "Volkstrauertag" or Remembrance
Day ceremony, held on Sunday 17th
November 2013. The town memorial is
at Bergertor, near the river weir at the
junction of Bergertorstrasse, Berliner
Strasse, and Salzufler Stasse. Different
in style to a British one, it is a group
of many bronze crosses arranged in
a tall vertical structure. Along with
representatives of Herford organisations

and onlookers, they listened to memorial speeches from Herr Christian Manz, the Landrat of Kreis Herford (Head of the District Administration), and pupils of the Otto-Hahn-Realschule. The Regimental 2IC and RSM laid a poppy wreath on behalf of 1 ADSR, alongside the Royal British Legion Herford Branch, and local military and civilian groups from the Herford area, before accepting a little Stadt hospitality, of some Kaffee and Kuchen in town.
